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ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE VARIOUS VOTING PRECINCTS IN
UNINCORPORATED POLK COUNTY, IOWA, AND DEFINING THE BOUNDARIES
PURSUANT TO CODE OF IOWA, CHAPTER 49

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors, representing Polk County, Iowa, for the convenience of its citizens and to facilitate the casting and counting of ballots at elections, is hereby divided unincorporated Polk County into 20 precincts as described in the attached document entitled "Polk County Redistricting Ordinance," and;

WHEREAS, the aforescribed shall be made a part of the Code of Ordinances, Polk County, Iowa as provided by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publications as provided by law with the effective date of the established precincts being January 15, 2022.

40.1 GENERAL PURPOSE

Iowa Code (331.210A) requires that the county Board of Supervisors establish a temporary county redistricting commission. The temporary county redistricting commission reviews and recommends changes in precinct boundaries of the unincorporated areas of the county in order to be submitted to the Secretary of State of the non-election year following each federal decennial census. A County Reprecincting Plan has been presented to and approved by the Polk County Board of Supervisors.

40.2 FORM

The form by which the precinct boundaries are described is defined by specific precinct descriptions and outlining boundaries and is attached to this ordinance as Appendix A.

40.3 ADMINISTRATION

Administration of precinct boundaries lies within the responsibility of the County Auditor/Commissioner of Elections.

40.4 RULE MAKING AUTHORITY

The rule making authority is as outlined in Chapter 49 and 331.210A of the Code of Iowa.

40.5 DEFINITIONS

- a. "Federal decennial census" – the decennial census required by federal law to be conducted by the United States Bureau of the Census in every year ending in zero
- b. "Precinct Boundaries" – a specific geographical area containing voter population within the county.
- c. "Temporary County Redistricting Commission" – a commission established to acquire population data from the latest federal decennial census including corresponding census maps and use that information in drawing and adopting the county's supervisor districting plan.

40.6 EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall be effective upon final passage, approve and publication as provided by Law.
