Black History Month February 2022

Whereas, Black History Month, also known as African American History Month, is a celebration of the contributions and achievements of African Americans and a time for recognizing their central role in U.S. history; and

Whereas, The celebration of Black History Month traces back to 1915, when Dr. Carter G. Woodson and minister Jesse E. Moorland founded the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH), an organization dedicated to researching and promoting achievements by Black Americans and other peoples of African descent; and

Whereas, In 1926, Dr. Woodson and ASALH sponsored the first Black History week, choosing the second week of February to coincide with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass; and

Whereas, The Civil Rights Movement and a growing awareness of Black identity in the late 1960s helped evolve Black History week into a month- long celebration; and

Whereas, In 1976, President Gerald Ford issued the first African-American History Month proclamation, calling upon the public to celebrate this observance each February and since that time, U.S. presidents have issued proclamations to pay tribute to African Americans and endorsed a specific theme; and

Whereas, This year's theme, "Black Health and Wellness," focuses on the activities, rituals and initiatives that Black communities have done to be well; and

Whereas, Polk County honors the contributions, sacrifices, and accomplishments of African Americans in the community and throughout the history of the nation; and

Now, Therefore, be it resolved that we, the Polk County Board of Supervisors, do hereby proclaim **February 2022 to be:**

Black History Month

in Polk County, Iowa and encourage all residents to observe this month by participating in programs, partnerships, activities, and events taking place throughout the area to celebrate Black history.

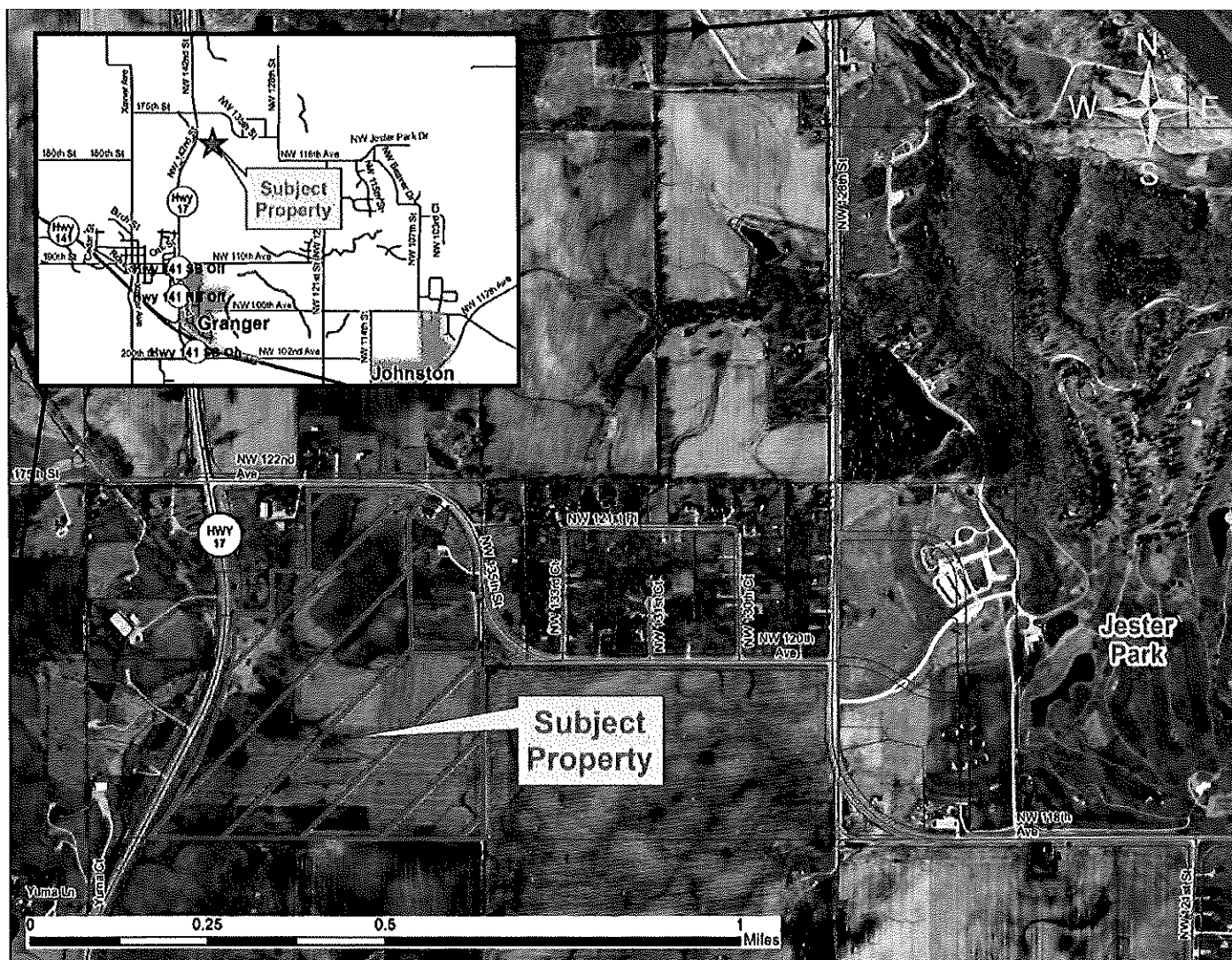

Background: In March of 2020, Polk County, Iowa began operating the Polk County Financial Empowerment Center, providing individual financial counseling to Polk County residents, with partial funding through a grant from the Cities for Financial Empowerment Fund (CFE Fund). Polk County has recently been awarded a new grant from CFE Fund, for a Small Business Boost Pilot program for integration of individual financial counseling with local small business and entrepreneurship activities. The grant is for \$90,000.00, which will be received over the course of two fiscal years. Small Business Boost services will be included in overall Polk County Financial Empowerment Center operations, in a new Agreement with the Des Moines Area Community College and Evelyn K. Davis Center for Working Families from March of 2022 through June of 2024.

Action Impact: Approval of this Second Amendment to Agreement will allow Polk County to demonstrate its commitment to enhancing the quality of life of its residents by engaging in anti-poverty efforts.

Fiscal Note: The budget in this table is that of the overall Financial Empowerment Center, including the Small Business Boost Pilot program. Revenue reflects that from the Cities for Financial Empowerment Fund as well as American Rescue Plan funds

WHEREAS, since March of 2020, Polk County, Iowa has operated the Polk County Financial Empowerment Center, to provide professional financial counseling for Polk County residents at no cost to participants, following a Cities for Financial Empowerment Fund (CFE Fund) model; and

WHEREAS, the services of the Polk County Financial Empowerment Center are provided through an Agreement with the Des Moines Area Community College and Evelyn K. Davis Center for Working Families, which has extensive experience providing financial literacy activities, employment training, individual financial coaching, small business guidance and related services supporting financial well-being and economic mobility; and

WHEREAS, the CFE Fund has recently awarded Polk County, Iowa a Small Business Boost grant for \$90,000, designed to complement existing support and education for small business owners by providing financial counseling tailored to the needs of small business owners; and

WHEREAS, financial counseling for Polk County residents, small business owners and entrepreneurs is consistent with Polk County's commitment to financial well-being, which is also one of Polk County's four priority areas for utilization of American Rescue Plan funds; and

WHEREAS, the current Agreement with the Des Moines Area Community College and Evelyn K. Davis Center for Working Families expires in February 2022, and Polk County, Iowa wishes to enter into a new Agreement to provide individual and small business financial coaching through June of 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED Polk County, Iowa approves the terms of the attached Agreement, with the Des Moines Area Community College and Evelyn K. Davis Center for Working Families, to provide individual and small business owners financial coaching through a Polk County Financial Empowerment Center, and authorizes the Chairperson of the Polk County Board of Supervisors to sign said Agreement on behalf of Polk County, Iowa.

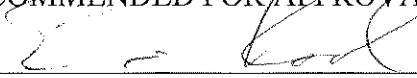

Previous Action taken by the Board: A similar agreement was approved on December 3, 2019

Board/Commission Actions:

Action Requested (Recommended): Approval is recommended.

Comply with Policy: Yes

Background: In March of 2020, Polk County, Iowa began providing professional financial counseling for Polk County residents as a public service through the Polk County Financial Empowerment Center. This service is provided through an Agreement with the Evelyn K. Davis Center for Working Families, a non-profit subsidiary of the Des Moines Area Community College, which has extensive experience with economic mobility-related services.

As of December 2021, more than 500 residents have received these services. Outcomes include reduction of household debt by more than \$1,200,000.00, household savings of more than \$500,000.00, and other financial outcomes including increased credit scores and reduced number of delinquent credit accounts. Polk County, Iowa has recently been awarded an additional grant for \$90,000.00 to expand services to small business owners.

In exchange for providing four full-time financial counselors and a program manager to continue providing services, Polk County, Iowa will pay Des Moines Area Community College an amount not to exceed \$1,100,000.00 from March 2022 through June of 2024. This expense will be paid from a grant from CFE Fund, from American Rescue Plan funds and from Polk County General Funds.

Action Impact: Approval of this Agreement will allow Polk County to demonstrate its commitment to enhancing the quality of life of its residents by engaging in anti-poverty efforts.
